The *Tree Tales* exhibition is a fairy tale of trees. Profoundly in love with wood, the Danish designer and Master-cabinet maker Laura Bergsøe has devoted her life to revealing the personality and “soul” of the trees that she sources all over the world for her dream-like tables, shelves, lamps and wall reliefs. Bergsøe works with the uniqueness of each piece of wood – its veins and knots, twists and turns - which she enhances through precious metals and materials, such as liquid silver, bronze and raw diamonds, delicately inserted into the wood. Rich with imaginative details, such as butterfly joints, bronze and silver ornaments or mammoth teeths, Bergsøe turns the inside of the tree into a wonderland of sprouts and flowers, butterflies, silver lakes and diamond drops.

Bergsøe’s sculptural works masterly combine the natural and the precious, bearing witness to the heritage of both Art Nouveau and Art Deco with their ornamental naturalism and noble materials and techniques. Her intention is to pass on her material understanding and enjoyment of wood through a high degree of tactility and craftsmanship, and to create a sense of wonder and responsibility towards the planet and its resources. Each piece is unique and holds a Signature Spike, a pure silver spike, placed into the side of the piece, which can be removed to reveal its story and origin.

Laura Bergsøe (b.1972, Denmark) was trained as a Master Cabinetmaker from the prestigious Cabinetmaker Rud. Rasmussen's workshop in Copenhagen, 1995-99, and established her own workshop in Copenhagen in 2006. Her works have been included in various exhibitions, such as “Natural State of Mind”, Rundetaarn, Copenhagen, Denmark, 2015; “Bergsøe Tables”, Icon House Dubai, 2016; “New Danish Modern”, Aarhus, Denmark, 2017; “Never Compete Nature”, Oxford Street, London, 2019; “Portrayal of Wood”, Copenhagen, Denmark, 2023. Bergsøe’s tables are part of important private collections and included in Georg Jensen’s flagship stores in Copenhagen, London, Munich, Stockholm, Tokyo, New York and Dubai.

L'exposition *Tree Tales* est un conte merveilleux inspiré par les arbres. Profondément amoureuse du bois, l'artiste et maître ébéniste danoise Laura Bergsøe a consacré sa vie à révéler la personnalité et l'« âme » des arbres qu'elle sélectionne à travers le monde pour créer ses tables, lampes, étagères et reliefs muraux, empreints de poésie et d'émerveillement. Bergsøe cultive l'unicité de chaque morceau de bois massif – ses veines, ses nœuds, ses courbes et ses torsions – qu'elle sublime avec des métaux et des pierres précieuses, tels que l'argent liquide, le bronze et les diamants bruts, délicatement insérés dans le bois. Riches de détails originaux, comme des joints en forme de papillon, des ornements en bronze et en argent ou des dents de mammouth, les œuvres de Bergsøe transforment l'intérieur de l'arbre en un véritable pays des merveilles peuplé de jeunes pousses et de fleurs, de papillons, de lacs d'argent et de gouttes de diamants.

Les œuvres sculpturales de Bergsøe marient avec maîtrise le naturel et le précieux, témoignant de l'héritage à la fois de l'Art nouveau et de l'Art déco, par leur naturalisme ornemental et leurs matériaux et techniques nobles. A travers une grande sensibilité tactile et un savoir-faire exceptionnel, l'artiste aspire à transmettre sa compréhension et son plaisir du bois, tout en suscitant un sentiment d'émerveillement et de responsabilité envers la planète et ses ressources. Chaque pièce est unique et porte un Signature Spike: une pointe en argent pur, insérée sur le côté de l'œuvre, qui peut être retirée et révéler, par un petit texte gravé, son histoire et son origine.


Laura Bergsøe (b.1972, Denmark) a été formée en tant que maître ébéniste dans le prestigieux atelier de l'ébéniste Rud. Rasmussen à Copenhague, de 1995 à 1999, avant de fonder son propre atelier à Copenhague en 2006. Ses œuvres ont été présentées dans de nombreuses expositions, telles que « Natural State of Mind », Rundetaarn, Copenhague, Danemark, en 2015 ; « Bergsøe Tables », Icon House Dubai, 2016 ; « New Danish Modern », Aarhus, Danemark, 2017 ; « Never Compete Nature », Oxford Street, Londres, 2019 ; et « Portrayal of Wood », Copenhague, Danemark, 2023. Les tables de Bergsøe font partie de collections privées importantes et sont exposées dans les magasins de Georg Jensen à Copenhague, Londres, Munich, Stockholm, Tokyo, New York et Dubaï.

Each table has its own story, and no wood is too special. Sourced by Bergsøe herself from all over the world, she takes her point of departure in the beauty and particularity of the specific piece of wood - walnut wood from Grenoble, 6000-years-old bog oak, yew or pear wood - all kinds of wood with an interesting grain, pattern and story potentially become a new piece of furniture to the designer, who takes her point of departure in the beauty and particularity of the specific piece of wood, enhancing its traits with her exquisite Butterfly connections and various materials such as silver, bronze, stones and diamonds.



Laura Bergsoe finishes her tables with a signature silver or bronze spike that screws into the side of the table. Each spike is engraved with the materials used in the project, and where the tree was cut. Then the future owner adds a small personal note, something they wish to be passed down the generations – ‘something a great, great grandchild will read and then send that person a loving thought,’ Laura explains. ‘It’s a way of dealing with our mindless “use and throw away” culture. Also, the spike is a great, old cabinetmaker’s tool, used to assemble and separate materials. The signature spike is a tale of craftsmanship, awareness and love.’








Myrtle Silver Sconce (Tasmania), 2024, detail




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
